### Red Wine

#### **Grenache / Syrah, La Rarete**

Vin de Pays d'Oc, France

*A beautifully crafted red wine made using the two most opulent red grape varieties: Grenache and Syrah. This blend produces a rich, rounded, voluptuously soft style of wine with flavours of spice, cherries and a hint of chocolate.*

#### **Malbec, Finca La Nina 2010**

Argentina

*A medium bodied Malbec with ripe red and black fruit flavours perfectly balanced with spice, chocolate and coffee notes from its time in French oak barrels.*

Paraidso, Italy

*From further south in Italy, this is a fashionable medium weight juicy red that is perfect to drink with tomato based dishes, poultry and grills.*

*A round and plush deep purple Shiraz with a delicious forward style. Subtle toasty vanilla, oak, spices and supple tannins underpin the lingering chocolate and berry flavours of the complex and elegant shining fruit.*

Chile

*A deep ruby colour with a nose that is dominated by ripe, blackcurrant fruit. The wine is supple with soft tannins and acidity.*

Bordeaux, France

*This blend of 70% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 10% Cabernet Franc offers classic Claret scents and flavours. Amazing value, it has a lovely deep purple colour, offers ripe bramble, spice and cedar on the nose and a super soft, black fruited, balanced finish.*

#### **Merlot Reserva, Santa Ema 2005**

Maipo Valley, Chile

*A blockbuster of a wine with thick red and black fruit flavours, liquorice, chocolate and coffee. Not for the faint hearted.*

*Classically brilliant wine with a multitude of layers of flavour. Medium bodied and elegant with spicy red fruit, coconut and vanilla. Perfect with lamb.*

Piedmont, Italy

*The great wine of Northern Italy. Full bodied, complex and elegant. Black fruits, leather, tar and a distinctive hint of rose petals.*

Jerome Quiot, Rhone Valley

*Grenache and Syrah grapes giving a medium bodied red with masses of ripe black fruit on the nose. Juicy and delicious.*

## White Wine

**Chenin Blanc, The Veldt Range 2009** **£16.00**

Robertson, South Africa

*Melon and honey aromas on the nose, with soft tropical fruit flavours dominating the palate and an elegant, refreshing acidity on the finish.*

Sicily, Italy

*Fresh stone fruits on the nose, followed by a zingy citrus fruit character with a hint of creaminess on the palate.*

South Eastern Australia

*Off dry wine with a lovely fresh floral character and jam packed with crisp fruit flavours of guava and fruit salad.*

**Sauvignon Blanc, Terres Fumees 2008** **£22.15**

Vin De Pays d'Oc, France

*Super fresh and clean Sauvignon with green flavours, apple and gooseberry. A touch of oak gives the wine depth and complexity.*

**Pinot Grigio, La Casada 2008** **£18.05**

Veneto, Italy

*Fresh and zingy, with fabulous citrus fruit intensity and delightful floral aromas. The ultimate summer wine.*

**Sauvignon Blanc "Amplus" Santa Ema 2008** **£25.75**

Leyda Valley, Chile

*A particularly fresh style of Sauvignon which retains all the aromatic green flavours but has a lick of fresh minerals through it. The wine has more weight than you would expect from a Sauvignon but it is still elegant and crisp on the finish.*

**Petit Chablis, Domaine de Colombier 2008** **£32.70**

Burgundy, France

*Made from Chardonnay and unoaked. Lemon flavours dominate with a lick of toffee on the finish. Balanced, complex and refined.*

**Pinot Gris, Cattin 2008** **£28.80**

Alsace, France

*Delicate apple, pear and honeysuckle characters. The palate is elegant and medium bodied.*

**Muscadet Sevre et Maine Vieilles Vignes Foliette 2008** **£23.40**

Loire Valley, France

*Wonderfully dry and crisp wine with soft lemon fruit, a slightly nutty aroma and a refreshing finish. Perfect with shellfish.*

*Very fruity, aromatic wine, with scents of raspberries, strawberries and grenadine.*
